Announcement of Rs 1 lakh crore Agri Infrastructure Fund under Atmanirbhar Bharat Package by Union Finance Minister on 15.05.2020



Approval by the Cabinet Committee on 08.07.2020 chaired by Hon'ble Prime Minister



Formal Inauguration of the Scheme by Hon'ble Prime Minister in the presence of Union Agriculture Minister on 09.08.2020







**Size of the fund –** Rs. 1 lakh Crore, to be released on FCFS basis; upto 25 projects per individual beneficiary in diff. locations<sup>1</sup>



**Beneficiaries** - Farmers, FPOs, PACS, Entrepreneurs, Startups, SHG, APMCs, Federation etc.



Interest Subvention – 3% p.a. up to loan Rs. 2 Cr (NABARD loans for PACS at 1% post subvention)



**Credit Guarantee –** Under CGTMSE scheme for loan up to Rs. 2 Crore



Duration\_- 7 years (Including moratorium period of upto 2 years)



Gol support in lending process – facilitate and drive speedy sanctions through a user-friendly online portal



**Lending Institutions –** 24 Commercial Banks, 40 Cooperative Banks, NABARD, etc.



**Convergence -** Allowed to dovetail with several schemes (across ministries, state govt.)







#### Eligibility extended to include more beneficiaries -

 APMCs, State Agencies, National & State Federations of Cooperatives, Federations of Farmers Producers Organizations (FPOs) and Federations of Self-help Groups (SHGs) now eligible under the scheme



#### Cap on number of projects per beneficiary increased from 1 project to 25 projects –

- Private entities can now submit upto 25 applications under the scheme; projects to be in different locations having different LGD code
- No limit on applications for State agencies, Federations of farmer groups



#### APMCs can setup multiple projects in same location of different types -

 Interest subvention for loan upto Rs. 2 crore will be provided for each project of different infrastructure types e.g., cold storage, sorting, grading and assaying units, silos, etc. within the same market yard



#### Duration of the scheme extended from 4 to 6 years –

 Period of financial facility has been extended from 4 to 6 years upto 2025-26 and overall period of the scheme has been extended upto 2032-33

Modern silos can reduce wastage to less than 1% and reduce desperate sell

#### Post-harvest infrastructure

#### Warehouses



Warehouses can reduce wastage to less than 5% and improve PHM

### Integrated pack-houses



Drive exports by meeting international standards and quarantine safety

#### **Custom Hiring Centers**



Mechanization can help reduce costs/acre by ~30%

#### **Cold chain infrastructure**



Cold storages can reduce post-harvest losses to less than 5%

#### **Community drying yards**



Yards in every village - Can reduce post-harvest losses by 5% to 10%

#### Refrigerated transportation



Ensure long distance fresh produce transfer; wastage in transportation ~5%

#### **IoT/ Precision farming assets**



Promote AI based smart farming solutions – can increase yield by 10% - 20%



#### **Sub schemes under Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture**

35% – 50% capital subsidy for infra including cooling units, pack house, ripening chambers, reefer vans, etc.



#### **PM Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises Scheme**

35% capital subsidy along with additional support for FPOs, SHGs for working capital, training, DPR preparation



#### **Sub Mission on Agriculture Mechanization (SMAM)**

Community farming assets with up to 40% procurement subsidy for establishment of custom hiring service centers



#### Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY)

Convergence with state plan for funds provided by centre under RKVY scheme



#### **Sub-schemes under PM Kisan Sampada (PMSKY)**

35% capital subsidy for infra like cleaning, grading, sorting, packaging, drying, IQF etc.



#### **Operation Greens**

50% capital subsidy for TOP crops (Tomato, Onion, Potao) consisting of all components of integrated value chain development project: formation & capacity building of FPOs, quality production, post harvest infra like – sorting, grading, collection center, agrilogistics, infra at market/consumption points
