Key Learnings



Joining this training has cleared most of my doubts. One of my biggest weaknesses as an Agricultural Extension student was not being able to figure out what job opportunities or career scopes I had in my subject. This program made me realize that, as Extension professionals, we have more opportunities compared to many other agricultural disciplines. We are not confined to agriculture alone but can explore a wide range of roles in various organizations.

The group projects made me feel included and taught me how to collaborate effectively as part of a team, as well as contribute as an individual. As a first-year Ph.D. student, I was struggling to decide on my research topic. However, listening to the stories and field experiences shared by the speakers helped me realize how we, as Extension students, can contribute to improving the lives of farmers. The sessions helped me discover what I truly want to do for my Ph.D. research.

The training opened my eyes to the crucial role Extension agents play in supporting farmers and rural communities, and how our work can influence policymakers. The session on "AI Tools for Academic Research" was especially beneficial, as it will be helpful during my research. I now believe that, in today's world, we should be aware of AI tools to work more efficiently.

The visit to Access Livelihoods gave me an understanding of how the organization operates and how it works hand-in-hand with farmers. This experience helped me see farmers from a new perspective. I'm also grateful for the opportunity to be part of a focus group discussion, it was a unique and insightful experience.

Training Experience
