Day 1: Exploring the Global Scope and Career Opportunities in Agricultural Extension

The training began with an insightful introduction to the field of Agricultural Extension. Dr. Saravanan Raj candidly shared the challenges he faced in the early stages of his career, offering valuable lessons in resilience and perseverance. He emphasized the global relevance of Agricultural Extension and highlighted the wide range of career opportunities within the field.

A significant part of the session focused on building core competencies essential for success. The day set a positive tone for the training, fostering deeper а appreciation for the field's impact on development. agricultural We also engaged in a group activity that allowed participants from different parts of India to get acquainted, laying the foundation for peer learning and collaboration.



Day 2: Exploring Research Priorities and Policy Engagement in Agricultural Extension

Dr. Saravanan Raj opened the day with a discussion on evolving research priorities in Agricultural Extension, emphasizing its interdisciplinary nature and integration with cross-cutting themes like gender, value chain development, and ICTs.

Following this, Dr. Rasheed Sulaiman presented "The Road Not Taken: Opportunities Extension Graduates Often Ignore", encouraging us to pursue less explored but highimpact roles. He introduced us to GFRAS (Global Forum for Rural Advisory Services) and elaborated on the capacities needed in the extension profession. In the afternoon, Dr. Sulaiman also led a session on policy engagement, covering policy analysis, evidence-based advocacy, and how to craft impactful policy briefs.

The evening session by Dr. Sreeram Vishnu Sir introduced Social Network Analysis (SNA). He discussed key theories such as the Strength of Weak Ties, Structural Holes, and Small World Networks, and provided hands-on exposure to tools like NetDraw and Gephi, useful for visualizing and analyzing social data.

Day 3: Field Exposure and Research Methodology

The day began with a field visit to Access Livelihoods Consulting, an organization working to transform rural livelihoods through innovative models. In the afternoon, Dr. P. Sethuraman delivered a standout session on research methodology. He delved into advanced approaches to measurement and scaling in social science research, making the session both intellectually engaging and practically useful. The day concluded with a presentation by Mr. M. Kumar from CDAC, who spoke about the role of Information Technology in Agriculture, including AI, blockchain, cloud computing, and big data tools revolutionizing modern extension.



Day 4: Exploring Global study opportunities and Social Dynamics

The day began with sessions on global education and career pathways. Speakers including Dr. Vikram Koundinya, Ms. Sravani Reddy, Ms. Laxmi Prasanna Kandi, and Dr. Parmveer Singh offered valuable insights on graduate programs, fellowships, and career growth abroad.

In the afternoon, Dr. Mahesh Chander delivered a powerful session on gender equality in agricultural extension, inclusivity emphasizing as а cornerstone of effective development. This was followed by a captivating Suchiradipta, presentation by Dr. further enriched which our understanding of social dimensions in policy and extension.



Day 5: Research Tools and Evaluation Frameworks

The final day began with an informative session by Dr. Raahalya on contemporary research trends in Agricultural Extension, including techniques like truncation, metadata analysis, and bibliometric methods.

Later, Dr. P.V.K. Sasidhar conducted an insightful session on Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E). He explained M&E frameworks, their practical application in extension programs, and led a live Focus Group Discussion (FGD) exercise that gave us hands-on experience in qualitative research. We concluded the day with outdoor group reflections, which offered a refreshing and dynamic setting to consolidate our learnings and share key takeaways.
