Strengthening Foundations and Harvesting Global Opportunities: A Ph.D. Scholar's Reflection on the MANAGE NYPDP Experience

The MANAGE NYPDP training program has been an enriching and transformative experience for me. As a second-year Ph.D. scholar focusing on Agricultural Extension, this training opened my eyes to new perspectives, methodologies, and career opportunities that I had not previously considered.

### **Key Learnings**

#### Day 1: A New Perspective on Agricultural Extension

The journey began with an inspiring session by Dr. Saravanan Raj, Director of MANAGE. His story deeply resonated with me, especially as someone passionate about showcasing Agricultural Extension as a dynamic and impactful discipline. I have always believed that Agricultural Extension deserves equal recognition as any other academic field, and his words reaffirmed that belief. His journey reminded me that every situation, no matter how challenging, holds the potential to become an opportunity for growth and learning. The day ended with a group activity where we discussed the challenges and opportunities in the field. Interacting with fellow research scholars was enriching, offering me diverse perspectives.



Day 2: Rethinking Agricultural Extension

On the second day, I had the privilege of attending an excellent session by Dr. Rasheed Sulaiman, who highlighted the importance of enhancing the current curriculum to build the competencies of extension professionals. He emphasized how research findings can be translated into societal impact through policy briefs and discussions. This shifted my perception of extension work, it's no longer just about technology transfer, but about creating meaningful societal change. A session on Social Network Analysis (SNA) further expanded my understanding of research methodologies.

# Day 3: Learning Through Field Visit and Expert Sessions

The third day included a visit to Access Livelihoods, where I saw firsthand how organizations serve farming communities. This hands-on experience helped me understand the challenges and rewards of service-oriented work in agriculture. A session on research methodology by Dr. Seethuraman provided valuable guidance on scale construction and ensuring research reliability. The session on the use of AI in agriculture particularly excited me, as I am currently exploring ways to integrate AI and blockchain in farming systems.

## Day 4: Exploring Career Opportunities and Research Collaborations

The fourth day focused on career prospects abroad and international research collaborations. Sessions by Mr. Vikram, Ms. Sravani, Ms. Laxmi, and Mr. Paramveer opened new avenues for advancing a career in Agricultural Extension.



Dr. Mahesh Chander's session on gender and international research collaborations left a profound impact. His journey across 52 countries, working on global agricultural projects, deeply inspired me. It showed me that with dedication and vision, it's possible to contribute meaningfully on a global scale. The day concluded with a session on policy engagement, where we brainstormed the implications of our research.

### Day 5: Research Paper Writing and Evaluation Techniques

The final day began with a session on academic writing and bibliometric analysis by Dr. Rahalya. It helped refine my writing approach to ensure my research is impactful and well-grounded. We also had a session on monitoring and evaluation, where Dr. Sasidhar guided us through the process of conducting focus group discussions. The week concluded with reflections, and I left with a renewed sense of purpose and direction in my research journey.



This training significantly changed my outlook on Agricultural Extension. I now view it as a platform to create greater societal impact through policy, research. and inclusive development. The also training highlighted the importance of aligning with the updated curriculum to stay relevant in today's competitive landscape.

As a recommendation, I suggest organizing mandatory online orientation sessions for students across universities to highlight the significance and relevance of the evolving curriculum and its impact on employability.
