
From Herding Buffaloes to Learning with Fellows: The Adventure of a Village Boy to MANAGE

The MANAGE National Young Professionals Development Program (NYPDP) provided a transformative learning experience that significantly understanding shaped my of agricultural extension and my professional aspirations. Over five intensive days, I engaged with expert resource persons, connected with peers from diverse backgrounds, and gained valuable insights that will influence my academic and career journey. Key learnings from each day were:



Day 1: Inspiration and Perseverance

Dr. Saravanan Raj's journey from a young doctoral candidate with limited publications and academic experience to being selected as an Assistant Professor and now serving as the Director of MANAGE, deeply resonated with me. His story exemplified how perseverance, hard work, and self-belief can overcome seemingly insurmountable obstacles. Thriving for over fifteen years in the culturally distinct state of Arunachal Pradesh, while facing innumerable daily challenges, his career trajectory is a powerful reminder that determination can lead to remarkable achievements, regardless of one's initial circumstances. In him, I saw how passionate someone could be about agricultural extension. I am deeply inspired by his sacrifice and his dedication to organizing this training solely to encourage students pursuing this field. His commitment extends beyond professional duty, reflecting a genuine desire to nurture the next generation of extension professionals.

Day 2: New Perspectives in Agricultural Extension

Dr. Rasheed Sulaiman's session on emerging competencies in agricultural extension was particularly enlightening. His work with the Agricultural Extension in South Asia (AESA) initiative and insights into policy engagement opened my eyes to new approaches in the field. The session challenged me to think beyond traditional extension methods and to consider how policy-level interventions can create systemic change. I felt strongly encouraged to revive my writing habit, especially through blogs, research articles, and possibly policy papers in the future.

Day 3: Practical Approaches to Rural Development

The visit to Access Livelihoods was exceptionally valuable in helping me understand grassroots implementation. The session on graduate study and career opportunities in the United States aligned perfectly with my aspirations to pursue doctoral studies abroad. Dr. Mahesh Chander's experiences inspired me to explore diverse knowledge dissemination channels, from blogging and academic publishing to potentially authoring books. The outdoor group exercises, focused on reflecting upon earlier sessions, fostered collaborative learning in a relaxed environment.

Day 5: Monitoring, Evaluation, and Research Methods

Dr. P.V.K. Sasidhar's session on Monitoring and Evaluation, especially the hands-on experience with Focus Group Discussion (FGD) techniques, was the most impactful part of the program. The clarity of concepts, practical orientation, and immediate applicability made this session one of the most valuable learning experiences of my academic journey.



This five-day program served as a profound wake-up call, prompting me to critically evaluate my relationship with agricultural extension. While I've always claimed passion for this subject, the training made me realize how much more there is to learn and the level of dedication required to truly master the field. It not only expanded my knowledge but also led to a deep, personal reassessment of my commitment to this discipline.
