The very first day was made memorable by the inspiring words of Dr. Saravanan Raj, who introduced us to his profound love for extension. He encouraged us to reflect on the various competencies required of extension professionals and assigned us a task that gave me serious insights about my future as an extension graduate. A prominent moment of Day 1 was marked by Dr. Saravanan Raj's words: "Celebrate small achievements in your life" and "We must speak whenever the opportunity is given." Day 2 brought to light the critical role of digital communication, agri-tech, sustainability, and policy in agricultural extension. Experts shared valuable insights into social media tools, AI in extension, modern research methods, and the importance of ecological resilience.

One of my favourite sessions was by Dr. Ramanjaneyulu, who offered a powerful and realistic perspective on the current agricultural landscape in India and the challenges faced by our farmers. His words were eye-opening and deeply moving.

A field visit to Access Livelihoods provided firsthand insights into successful FPO models and community-based enterprise development. Later, sessions on indigenous food systems, organic farming, and rural agri-innovation emphasized inclusivity, youth involvement, and gender equity. Celebrating Dr. Saravanan Raj's birthday added a warm, personal touch to the day. The evening visit to Charminar beautifully merged cultural immersion with professional learning.



Day 4 offered global perspectives and practical exposure. International scholars shared pathways for pursuing education abroad in Extension Education, while experts like Dr. Parmveer Singh and Dr. Arun Balamatti led enriching sessions on leadership and emerging trends in research. The visit to C-DAC was a highlight, showcasing cutting-edge agri-tech innovations including AI, blockchain, and data analytics. 
#### **Training Experience**


## **Change in Perspective**

### Main Takeaway

Staying current with the latest developments is crucial for preparing students and professionals for real-world challenges.
- Effectiveness of Policy Making: I realized that effective policy-making and well-designed schemes are essential for improving the economic life of farmers.
- Personality Development: Each session of the training program had a strong impact on my personality. It taught me how to present extension as an engaging subject, how to connect with students or target audiences creatively, and how to overcome stage fear. I also learned to make the best use of every opportunity to speak and share, shaping myself into a more confident and effective educator.

## **Action Plan**

The NYPD program provided me with valuable insights that I will meaningfully apply in both my research and teaching career. Interactions with experts were particularly impactful, as they clarified many doubts I previously had about the extension sector.
