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 - **1.** International Training Program on "Post-harvest Technology in Horticulture Crops" held during 6- 20th November, 2017 at ICAR- Indian Institute of Horticultural Research (IIHR), Bengaluru, Karnataka.



Twelfth International Training Program on ""Post-harvest Technology in Horticulture Crops" was organized during 06-20th November, 2017 at ICAR- Indian Institute of Horticultural Research (IIHR), Bengaluru, Karnataka, India. Under this training program 26 executives from 12 countries, i.e. Afghanistan, Botswana, Cambodia, Ghana, Kenya, Liberia, Malawi, Mongolia, Mozambique, Myanmar, Sudan and Uganda were participated. Out of the total number of executives, 16 were male and 10 were female executives.

Program included both class room sessions and field visits. During the program, executives visited ICAR-IIHR experimental plots and various infrastructural facilities, such as Referral food testing laboratory, polyhouses and other laboratories connected with Postharvest technology. And also visited companies dealing with domestic supply and export of fresh horticultural crops, processing units, and also the processing machinery manufacturers.

Executives were trained in the technologies namely waste valorization/ by-product/ residue management in horticultural crops, cost effective technologies for processing and value-addition of important horticultural crops, Different methods of storage systems including on-farm storage, dry storage, cold storage and refrigerated distribution system and retailing of fruits and vegetables largely grown in Afro-Asian countries.



The training program concluded on 20th November, 2017 in the presence of Dr. P. Chandra Shekara, Director (Agril. Extn.), National Institute of Agricultural Extension Management (MANAGE), Hyderabad. On the last day of training program, executives presented their Back At Work Plan based on the learning they acquired during the training period at IIHR, Bengaluru, Karnataka. That can be executed in their respective countries. The overall rating of the training program was 8.8 out of 10 as per executive's feedback.
