Efficient Warehousing: The Cornerstone of food security in India

The idea of logistic parks and unified logistics interface platform announced in Budget 2022 needs execution beyond policy making. In July 2021, the State of Food Security and Nutrition in the World (SOFI) report revealed that food insecurity in India increased by 6.8 percentage points during 2018-2020. The period covered in the report was one when the Covid-19 pandemic was spreading across the country and a national lockdown had been announced. The same report also reveals that over six crore people became prey to food insecurity during 2014—2019.

Modi's farm reform reversal to impact private investment in agriculture

India's repeal of agriculture laws aimed at liberalizing produce markets will have an impact on much needed private investment in farm sector and saddle the government with budget-sapping subsidies for years. India ranks 101 out of 116 countries on the Global Hunger Index, with malnutrition accounting for 68 percent of child deaths. Yet it wastes around 67 million tonnes of food every year, worth about \$12.25 billion - nearly five times that of most large economies - according to various studies. Inadequate cold-chain storage, shortages of refrigerated trucks and insufficient food processing facilities are the main causes of waste.

NERL facilitates over Rs 2,000 cr loans against eNWR in 3 years

National E-Repository Limited (NERL), an NCDEX group company and a WDRA (Warehousing Development and Regulatory Authority) regulated entity has facilitated loans worth more than Rs 2,000 crore against electronic Negotiable Warehouse Receipts (eNWR) as on date.....This year regulators, banks and the government encouraged the use of eNWRs for financing stored commodities in WDRA registered warehouses. eNWR is bringing liquidity and trade at a warehouse level for helping farmers, FPOs and other market intermediaries.

Budget 2022 for agri-value addition

The government is drawing up a plan to incentivize value addition in agriculture that can boost farmers' incomes, as it looks to ensure development of the sector even after the withdrawal of Farm Laws late last year. The broad thrust of the strategy is to encourage backward linkages to the farm, officials said. The Government is also eyeing incentives over and above the ₹10,900 crore production linked incentive (PLI) scheme for food processing to promote the creation of relevant storage and logistics infrastructure. The gross value added (GVA) in the food processing sector was ₹2.24 lakh crore in FY20. The GVA in the food processing sector accounted for 11.38% of the GVA in agriculture and allied sectors.
