Status of 8th Batch of PGDAWM


The announcement for online admissions in the 8th Batch of the program was made on 1st July, 2022. The window for online application was available to the interested candidates for a period of three months from 1st July 2022 to 30th September 2022. A total of 350 applications were received through the online system created under the Program. Based on the eligibility, admission has finally been offered to a total of 210 Candidates.

The online window for registration in the next batch of the Program will be available from 1st January 2023.

Warehousing News - Some Glimpses

Registration to be must for 3rd-party agri warehouses

The central government plans to make it mandatory for third-party warehouses that stock agricultural commodities to register with Warehousing Development Authority by amending the Warehousing (Development & Regulations) Act (WDRA). The proposed amendment will encourage scientific warehousing ecosystems, thus helping farmers store their produce in scientific godowns. It will also make it compulsory for warehouse operators to issue digitised negotiable warehouse

receipts (NWR), making the system more transparent.

No imprisonment, compulsory registration are part of proposed changes in warehousing law

The Centre plans to amend the Warehousing (Development and Regulation) Act, 2007, and is likely to introduce a Bill in the current parliament session after the Cabinet approves it. Registration of warehouses above 100 tonnes capacity is proposed to be made mandatory, while the government also wants to decriminalise the law by abolishing provisions for jail upto 3-years.

Demand for agricultural loans and storage facilities is expected to increase significantly in the ongoing Kharif season as the pandemic situation seems under control and the impact of erratic rains remains minimal.

Foreign firms make a beeline to tap India's warehousing sector

Foreign companies are making a beeline to India to tap the fast-growing warehousing sector as the e-commerce boom, China+1 strategy of MNC companies, coupled with a spurt in FMCG, food, garments and pharma sectors, is leading to high demand to store goods. Since April, three major multinational companies – FM Logistic, Rhenus and Panattoni – have announced major plans in India.
