## WDRA signs pact with Bank of India to fund against e-NWRs

Warehousing Development Regulatory Authority (WDRA) has entered into a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the Bank of India to enable funding against electronic negotiable warehouse receipts (e-NWRs). This collaboration is designed to assist farmers and traders by offering loans at low-interest rates. The association is expected to promote awareness about the financing opportunities available with e-NWRs. Additionally, the agreement aims to inform depositors about the benefits of funding against e-NWRs, with further outreach activities planned to enhance agricultural pledge finance in India. This initiative reflects a broader push towards leveraging technology to modernize and streamline financial processes in the agriculture sector.

# India at the centre of global supply chain and logistics transformation: Shri Nitin Gadkari

The Supply Chain Management & Logistics Summit 2023 showcased the pivotal role India can play in the global supply chain and logistics transformation. Organized by ET Edge, the event brought together industry leaders and experts to discuss strategic initiatives, advancements in supply chain management, logistics, and maritime infrastructure. Shri Nitin Gadkari, the Minister of Road Transport & Highways, emphasized the crucial role to be played by Supply Chain Management & Logistics in achieving India's goal of a USD 5 Trillion economy. He outlined plans to reduce logistics costs from the current 14 - 16 percent to 9 percent by the end of 2024 with focus on improving roads, promoting alternative fuels, and maximizing the use of waterways. The summit underscored the importance of institutional reforms and legislative changes to streamline trade processes and create a favorable business environment.

# Central Warehousing Corporation to double revenues in 2 years, plans massive capacity expansion

Central Warehousing Corporation (CWC), India's largest public warehouse operator, aims to double its revenues within next two years by embarking on a comprehensive expansion strategy. With an existing capacity of 115 lakh MT (metric tonnes) spread across 465 locations in the country, the company plans to focus on capacity expansion, third-party logistics (3PL), and domestic container business. Shri Amit Kumar Singh, Managing Director of CWC, outlined the ambitious expansion plans, which involve adding approximately 47 lakh sqft of capacity over the next two years through a ₹1,000 crore investment in capital expenditure. Additionally, the Corporation is exploring public-private partnerships (PPPs) for modernization and facility creation in 85 locations, anticipating private sector investments of about ₹1,500 crore to add 120 lakh sqft of Grade A warehouse capacity.

# Agri & allied sector contribution to GDP can further rise by strengthening marketing with FPOs being the key: Shri Amit Shah

Cooperation Minister Shri Amit Shah addressed a conclave, emphasizing the pivotal role of marketing, particularly through Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), in boosting the contribution of agriculture and allied sectors to the country's GDP. Shri Shah suggested a "Hybrid Model" where existing FPOs can link themselves with Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS) through agreements. This model aims to provide services to cooperative members and enhance the overall effectiveness of both FPOs and PACS. He urged the National Cooperative Development Council and officials of the Cooperation Ministry to finalize a draft agreement that facilitates collaboration between PACS and FPOs.
