Grexit.....??

Greece, which is "THE BRONZE AGE MANHATTAN", known for its deities like "ZEUS, HADES, POSEIDON, HERCULES", for warriors like "ACHILLES" and prominent philosophers and astrologer like "Socrates", is now in an abysmal debt crisis. To understand what is happening in Greece and the Eurozone, think about a dinner party. If you are cooking for just you and your partner, it's easy. However, if you have guests, things get tougher. If you need to accommodate a vegan, someone who is glutton free, someone who is lactose intolerant and someone with soy allergy your options get limited which of course is the problem with Europe's idea of having the same currency. Usually, if there is high unemployment, what happens is that a country makes its currency cheaper vis-à-vis other currency that makes its products cheaper in the world market and it means that foreign investors can get a great deal of bargains. In January 1999, the Euro was launched which now binds 19 nations into a single currency zone, watched over by European Central Bank but leaves the budget and tax policy in the hands of each country.


If none of this is possible, the country would default in its debt and exit the Eurozone which would create instability in the region and reverberate around the globe, causing the complete breakdown of the Eurozone with dire economic consequences for every European country which is one of the most extreme forms of predicament. The Finance Minister, Mr. Varoufakis, chose to play hard ball with the European Union by making drastic proposals as he knew that it would attract a lot of media attention. His strategy was considered risky and it remains unclear if it will be effective. Most of the economists speculate that there is no real possibility for Greece to repay its entire debt. In order to keep the Eurozone intact, the European Union is likely reach a compromise that would involve extending the time for Greece to repay and offering a lower or even zero percent interest rate. The Prime Minister, Mr. Siriza said that for their part they will stay true to the vision of social justice providing aid to those Greeks who were hit hard by the austerity measures.

Over the next fifty years they are scheduled to repay the debt but with the economy in shambles many experts wonder if that goal is attainable? Greece can't print the money and pay off its debt since European Central Bank decides how much money to print. So to really work, you would need a much closer union where you have big financial transfers coming from the richer places to the poorer places. So the Eurozone is inchoately integrated in a way that doesn't really work. Facing the prospect of default by mid-2010 Greece entered into a loan agreement with a group of creditors consisting of Eurozone countries, IMF and the European Central Bank together called as TROIKA. Greece was forced to implement severe austerity measures in return for receiving loans from TROIKA which included significant spending cuts on public sector salaries and pension cuts and privatization of national industries. These measures were met with public resistance in the form of widespread protests and a nationwide strike. The austerity measures held deep ramifications for Greece and severe consequences for its citizens. The conditions that TROIKA demanded in return for bailing out the Greek economy were too harsh that it prompted an UN official to speculate that they constituted Human Rights violation. Greece was set to receive the final batch of funding on Feb 28th 2015. However, its recently elected left wing government had proclaimed its desire to halt austerity and renegotiate the terms on its debt, even suggesting that a new round of debt forgiveness would be necessary.

Is the bell ringing for Grexit?




The Grand Alumni Meet - REMINISCENCE'15



Sundar Pichai - The Pioneer of Pioneers



It is rightly said that "Success is a journey not a destination". With every mile we walk, the path of this journey gets clearer and when we look back at the way we walked, it seems to be all destined. I believe the X-factor we all talk about actually lies within us, however very few realize this. These people not only scale phenomenal heights but also build an aura to inspire millions. One such personality is the newly crowned CEO of Google, Sundar Pichai. At the age of just 43, he has achieved a position which is influential, enviable and a dream for many. Evidently such leaps never happen overnight, and his life is a stirring example of this.

Born in 1972, Pichai hails from a typical middle class family with of course certain financial restrictions. As a silent and a brilliant student, he went to Vanavani and Jawahar Vidyalaya in Chennai. He joined Google in 2004 where he was responsible for products like Chrome, Chrome OS and even Google Drive. Pichai was in the running for the post of CEO at Microsoft, before Satya Nadella was announced as its CEO. At one point of time he even had an option of shifting from Google to some other company, but Google, in order to retain such talent as his, offered him \$50 million in stocks. He played a pivotal role in many of Google's imperative decisions, as in acquiring Nest and handled financially important projects including setting of Chrome which brought the company into the big league. In the course of time he married his long-time girl-friend Anjali and has two kids. He is said to be a balanced person both professionally and personally.

Pichai being the 3rd CEO of Google and the First Non-White CEO in the company's history, is the epitome of success and inspiration for millions of budding managers and entrepreneurs. He is believed to be one of the most politically correct and neutral executives. Reaching the pinnacle, he is a living example that if you have conviction, passion and a strong dedication, sooner or later you will reach your goal. 
