
It's euphoric to report that 28 organizations extended offers to 56 students, and 10 PPOs with 3 PPIs were secured by students through their internship programs.

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WHY THE VENTURE STUDIO MODEL IS HERE TO STAY

There has rarely been a better time for aspiring business owners to plunge. Young business people now have access to support systems that allow them to develop ideas, test hypotheses, and eventually establish an enterprise even before they have ideas. The venture studio is one such example of a strategy for enhancing the abilities of potential entrepreneurs (VS).

VS is a company that develops startups internally by offering a combination of seed money, founding entrepreneurs or teams, and tools to locate a product-market fit, in a short period. It varies from the usual venture capital (VC) business principally because the founding team is typically internal and concepts are to be developed within the studio.

"We have detailed sub-sector maps on different industries & we identify which ones are underserved and therefore are ripe for a startup", said a vice president of a studio in New York. After determining that, we do brief yet thorough testing with customers to improve the concept. The 'founder' is chosen from our team members or someone we recruit from our network to move the idea further. By thoroughly vetting the proposal and providing resources and advice throughout the vital first few months, the goal is to reduce risk.

We will use our entire network to test the idea, find team members, unlock follow-on funding, and do anything else for the venture to be successful. In return, we will get a large stake in a startup that we understand well, in an industry we like, and where we have a higher chance of influencing their outcome.

In recent years, the VS model has developed a life of its own. It spans from those who generate ideas but hire externally for the original team to those who do everything in-house, including corporate VS, Studios developing concepts, and

employees accounting for the founding staff.

Particularly during the early stages of concept formulation and validation, this paradigm offers additional support. It is perfect for business owners who are somewhat idea-agnostic and like the implementation phase of the entrepreneurial journey. Although they are not committed to a specific ideology, they are content to work in a field that they find to be interesting and in which they ideally have experience. The entrepreneur should be happy with the tradeoff because investors take a significantly higher portion of stock than in a standard VC investment or an executive-inresidence (EiR) investment.

Culturally, the model is most suited for someone who prefers to have direction and assistance from the outset rather than taking on the kind of risk that comes with beginning something from scratch. But concurrently, they should possess the entrepreneurial spirit and are prepared to enter most industries to succeed.

Other benefits of the VS model include timetable flexibility and the ability to meet milestones because the studio supporting the startup is directly involved & there is little likelihood of surprises on either side. Compared to many other models, this results in an investor-entrepreneur relationship, which is much more cooperative. Theoretically, because only concepts with initial customer promise are introduced into businesses, this also provides higher risk reduction from an early stage.

Also, VS allows the entrepreneur to focus on the stages of the company they are most excited by. On one side, you could remain part of the VS and continue to test ideas and hand them over to another 'founder' once they have gained traction. On the other, you could come in once the ideas have been tested and focus on building

a company. Cons include giving up an increasing share of equity, limited control over the idea and the industry, and less flexibility and more oversight than a startup with traditional VC funding.

Whether the VS model completely replaces the

current models and ushers in venture capital 3.0 remains to be seen. It is safe to predict that the model is here to stay given the enthusiasm from investors, a general shift toward VC firms providing more value-added services, and the emergence of additional studios.

HIGHER EDUCATION VERSUS SKILL ACQUISITION

Given the rise in educated unemployment in the nation, education for the sole purpose of earning a degree is not desirable, which necessitates a deeper examination of the principles that underpin the goals and objectives of education on both an individual and a societal level. As per a report published by Ernst and Young, by the year 2026, demographically speaking, India would be in an advantageous position with approximately 64 percent of our population laying in the age bracket of 15-59 years, with only 13 percent of the population aged about 60. Skill-based education, therefore, is imperative for us to be able to reap the demographic dividend that a young population would offer. If the need for skilled labor is not met by education in a growing economy like ours, then it would fail its youth in attaining both the basic and the higher aspirations of life.

It calls for greater collaboration between schools and institutes of higher learning and educational institutions and industry partners. These collaborations would help to identify the required skill sets, which will reduce the gap in the curriculum at school and college education, and inculcation skills required by the industry and economy. The need of the hour is to ensure that the stakeholders from different levels of education work in consonance with each other and with experts from industry in enhancing the skilled manpower of the nation. It most definitely requires a higher public-private partnership at the level of educational institutions and industry.

Developing specialized courses at the school level which can also be pursued further at undergraduate and postgraduate levels, summer schools offered by higher education institutions and industry experts, and skilloriented short-term and long-term workshops or courses offered by professional bodies could be some appropriate measures in this direction.

Education must respond to a broader set of goals and assist them in achieving higher aspirations for their lives. Its role in nationbuilding and human progress can and must not be overlooked. Though skill education is important, higher education must be the site of knowledge acquisition, generation, creativity, and innovation.

INDIA'S UNHAPPY PROGRESS

India has recently surpassed the United Kingdom to become the fifth largest economy in the world with a size of \$854.7 billion (nominal cash, as of March 2022) and expanded its GDP by 13.5% in the April-June quarter or fiscal year 2023 to retain the tag of World's Fastest Growing Economy. India is also home to the third largest number of billionaires (221 billionaires) in the world and still, it ranked amongst the lowest in the United Nations World Happiness Report at 136th position out of 146 countries.

This report was released on March 18, 2022, and published by the United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network since 2012, to rank the countries by how happy their citizens perceive themselves to be. The report is based on two key ideas i.e. happiness or life evaluation measured through opinion surveys and identifying key elements that determine well-being and life evaluation across countries and takes into account a variety of parameters like gross domestic product per person, social support, personal freedom, levels of corruption, healthy life expectancy, and opinions of residents. The country hasn't been performing well on the index since it began slipping from 111th position, which was highest in 2013.

Clearly, the correlation between happiness and wealth is weak. The country's chronic unhappiness, can be attributed majorly to rapid urbanization and congestion in cities, concerns about food security and safe water safety, rising costs of health care, women's safety,

environmental pollution, and degradation and climate change; it saddens people to witnessing the ever-increasing inequality and seeing the rich and famous having fancy weddings, lavish parties, and luxurious vacations, not only this India reported the highest number of suicides in the world in 2021 and has an excruciating National Suicide Rate of 12 percent. People are insecure about their health because the question of the cost of treatment plagues their minds & being through a pandemic and realizing the uncertainties has deepened the pain.

The pandemic has drastically affected mental well-being, pushing many people towards anxiety and depression. WHAT THE JUNK, THE EARTH'S ORBIT GETTING HAIRY

Humans seem to leave their mark wherever they go. Unfortunately, they do not always leave a good impression. One such area where people have been competing for supremacy and investigating by pushing the limits is outer space.



Sputnik's launch on October 4, 1957, signaled the start of a fierce space race that culminated in decades of rocket and satellite launches and, ultimately, a significant amount of space debris. They have already started to leave space trash in this area as well. Debris left in space by nations, ranging from decrepit spacecraft to paint flakes, presents a problem for existing and future space initiatives. NASA and other organizations have been investigating, how this junk floating in space puts its spaceflights in danger.

Space junk, or space debris, is leftover satellite or propulsion system parts that float hundreds of miles above the Earth. According to SSN sensors of the US Department of Defence, more than 27,000 pieces of debris, also known as space junk, are still rotating in the orbit of the Earth, particularly in the lower part of the orbit.

The Problem of Space Debris

Concerns about space debris affecting access to and utilization of Earth orbit are likely driving these discussions, as

evidenced by enormous satellite constellations that are being assembled by companies like SpaceX and a Russian antisatellite (ASAT) test in November 2021 that constantly threatened the International Space Station operations.

The potential for accidents rises, which can produce significant amounts of debris clouds (as the Russian ASAT test did) as more & more satellite launches happen. Experts have emphasized that even a handful of these collisions might have a significant impact on several satellite-delivered services, including telecommunications, navigation, and weather forecasting.

Everyone is impacted by space debris, especially given the satellite technology usage in practically every aspect of modern life. Because it could take years and hundreds of millions of dollars to repair a destroyed satellite, space debris raises the cost of operating satellites. Critical sensors and spacecraft components can suffer severe damage from even minute debris. One millimetre-sized object can seriously harm a satellite if it strikes a crucial part, and one centimetre-sized object is deemed deadly if it hits a satellite.

Space debris increases the cost of running satellites since it can take years and hundreds of millions of dollars to repair a damaged satellite. Even tiny debris particles can cause serious harm to vital sensors and spaceship parts. One millimetre-sized item is considered lethal, if it impacts a satellite, while one centimetre-sized object is considered dangerous if it strikes a critical component of a satellite.

Complications in Space Debris Removal

Unfortunately, we are unable to brush or scrape up space debris and place it in a space waste bin. We must approach space trash closely and keep up a constant speed with each object if we are to remove it. Then we have to somehow connect to it and either reduce its orbit or reenter it into the atmosphere, where it will burn up.

Astronauts never attempt this operation since there is a risk of explosion if the object is a rocket stage with propellant still on board. Another concern is property rights; you cannot take a satellite or rocket that belongs to another nation without their consent. Higher space debris increases the chance of launch vehicles and satellites in orbit colliding. The SSN (Spiking Neutral Networks) typically alerts the owner or operator if it anticipates a collision between a cataloged item and a known operating satellite. Debris cannot be moved however if the other item is a satellite that can be moved, it might be possible for it to do so to avert a collision. Most satellite controllers must plan and carry out a collision avoidance maneuver over the course of several hours or days.


To safeguard their satellites, other countries employ their tracking information. As a result, using highly accurate assessment and prediction techniques is crucial for lowering the risk associated with current systems and upcoming launches.

Whom to blame?

A list of the nations that have produced the most space debris has been published by the German database giant Statista using information from NASA. At the top of the list is Russia. Statista reported this, citing data as of February 4, 2022, from NASA's Orbital Debris Quarterly News. Russia is followed closely by its rival, the United States of America, with 5,216 pieces of debris.

China stands at number three on the list with 3,845 pieces of debris. Japan and France

take the fourth and fifth spots, respectively, with 520 and 117 pieces of debris. India, with 114 pieces of debris bagged the sixth position.



Thank God BUMPER is here!

A tool utilized to cope with space debris is the Bumper. It was created by NASA, to aid the organization in determining the likelihood that a spacecraft may sustain damage from debris while in operation.

All changes to the code must be approved, reviewed, and documented, according to the Bumper Configuration Control Board (CCB). "Bumper 3" is the most recent version of Bumper. It uses the most recent meteoroid environment and orbital debris models. Additionally, the Bumper contains a sizable collection of ballistic limit "damage" equations that may be applied to a variety of changes to the code that must be approved, reviewed, and documented, according to the Bumper Configuration Control Board (CCB) systems.

It is high time now!

It is crucial and urgent to address the issue of space debris because doing so will cost us millions of dollars and take a very long time. Stringent International regulations, that penalize countries or businesses that contribute to space debris are therefore required.
