जय जवान किसान प्रशिक्षण का तीसरा बैच आरंभ

हैदराबाद, 26 अप्रैल-(मिलाप ब्यूरो) नेशनल इंस्टीट्यूट ऑफ एग्रीकल्चरल एक्सटेंशन मैनेजमेंट (मैनेज) में आज जय जवान किसान प्रशिक्षण कार्यक्रम के तीसरे बैच का उद्घाटन किया गया।
