Dr. Sagar Hanuman Singh, IPoS, Director General MANAGE, warmly welcomed the Joint Secretary and presented a brief overview of MANAGE and its key activities.

A brief on MANAGE's training programmes, ongoing schemes, flagship events, international programmes, IECHO training initiatives, implementation of Government of India schemes,

knowledge management and outreach activities, and educational programmes was also presented during the meeting.

Shri Sanjay Kumar Agarwal, IAS, interacted with MANAGE faculty and provided valuable suggestions on strengthening training programmes and related extension initiatives.

MANAGE faculty members, officers, and staff were present during the meeting and actively participated in the interaction.

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## MANAGE organised Aqua-Eureka 2025 and Incubation Program (Cohort-1) for Fisheries Startups



MANAGE Organized Two 5-Day Training Programmes: MANAGE Aqua-Eureka 2025 and Incubation Program (Cohort-1) during December 15–19, 2025. A total 33 and 21 participants attended the trainings respectively.

Dr. Saravanan Raj, Director (Agricultural Extension), MANAGE and CEO, MANAGE–MFish Hub, briefed the participants on both training programmes. He welcomed the participants and stated that this marks the launch of the first cohort under the MFish Hub, with a focused emphasis on the fisheries sector. He explained that the core objective of this cohort is to integrate ideas, innovations, and facilities from a wide range of stakeholders into a unified innovation ecosystem.

The programme brings together two categories of innovators—those who are already operating businesses in areas such as data, services, or IT-based solutions, and those who are currently at the idea stage. For existing



entrepreneurs, the Hub aims to support business expansion and scaling, while early-stage innovators will be guided to refine their ideas and progress to the next level.

Selected participants under the incubation and integration programme will be mentored and connected with relevant achievers and experts, enabling them to develop their concepts into working prototypes. He further informed that the centre planning to launch another series focusing on technologies developed by ICAR institutes, universities, and colleges, with the objective of commercialising these technologies and converting them into viable business opportunities.

In his inaugural address, Dr. Sagar Hanuman Singh, IPoS, Director General, MANAGE, stated that such programmes provide a valuable platform for sharing ideas and interacting with diverse stakeholders. He highlighted that many

innovators are working on IoT-based solutions and value addition of products to develop sustainable business models in the fisheries sector.

The Aqua Eureka programme focused on strengthening early-stage startups and innovators in the fisheries sector through a structured mentoring framework. The programme developed entrepreneurial, regulatory, and innovation capabilities while familiarising participants with the startup ecosystem.

The training promoted peer learning, networking, and collaboration among ecosystem stakeholders. Key themes included programme orientation, startup visioning, networking, and business plan preparation. Sessions covered startup certification, intellectual property rights, legal structures, and regulatory compliance. The programme also highlighted government schemes, pitch deck development, and business model design to enhance market readiness. A field exposure visit provided practical industry insights. The training concluded with final startup presentations, mentoring, and participant reflections to support idea validation, prototyping, and business scaling.

The Incubation Cohort–1 programme focused on startup orientation, networking, and business plan development to strengthen entrepreneurial readiness in the fisheries sector. It included sessions on startup certification, intellectual property protection, legal structures, and regulatory compliance to ensure lawful and sustainable operations. Participants were exposed to government schemes and sector-specific opportunities, along with practical inputs on pitch deck preparation and business model development using structured frameworks.

Experience-sharing sessions by startups provided real-world insights into entrepreneurial journeys and challenges. The programme also features field exposure visits to fisheries enterprises and startup support systems to enhance practical understanding. It concludes with mentoring, reflection, and consolidation of learnings to support idea refinement, validation, and business growth.

## MANAGE organized training Program on New Competencies, Career Opportunities and Research Priorities in Agricultural Extension



MANAGE organised a six-day National Young Professionals Development Programme on “New Competencies, Career Opportunities and Research Priorities in Agricultural Extension” from December 22 to 27, 2025. A total of 55 agricultural students from eight states across India participated in the programme.

During the inaugural interaction with the participants, Dr. Saravanan Raj, Director (Agricultural Extension), MANAGE and CEO, MANAGE–CIA, stated that young agricultural extension students should actively seek diverse opportunities, explore their potential, and develop an understanding beyond academic learning. He highlighted that agricultural extension is not merely about communication or technology transfer, but a powerful driver of change and development with growing global relevance. The programme focused on preparing next-



generation agricultural extension professionals for emerging global opportunities and evolving roles in the extension system. The objective of the programme was to help participants understand career pathways, essential competencies, and professional excellence in agricultural extension.

The training covered themes such as new competencies and job opportunities in agricultural extension, professional specialisation, ICTs and digital competencies, next-generation extension methods, research priorities, monitoring and evaluation, Delphi technique, focus group discussion methods, social network analysis, textometry, extension for entrepreneurship, gender equality, organic farming, development sector opportunities, agri-innovation through incubation, and policy engagement.

The programme also included exposure to innovation and digital knowledge ecosystems. The programme concluded with participants developing individual action plans for future professional engagement in agricultural extension.
