International Conference Food & Nutritional Security through Agriculture Ecosystem



During the inaugural address, Dr. P. Chandra Shekara, DG-MANAGE stated that food and nutritional security are not goals but a necessity. It becomes everyone's responsibility to design and implement policies to ensure food and nutritional security in the world, he said. He mentioned that MANAGE is mainstreaming food and nutritional security initiatives in its agricultural extension programs and schemes like training Input Dealers, Agripreneurs under AC&ABC, RKVY-RAFTAAR, and digital agriculture schemes.

Dr. Jonna Kane- Potaka said that we can't work in silos and we need to integrate our specializations to address food and nutritional security. She highlighted the on-going breakthrough research in rice at IRRI and stressed need for greater collaboration to ensure a transformational change at farmers level.

Dr. Samarendu Mohanty stated that achieving food security is possible only through a multi-disciplinary approach to address issues like climate change, soil health, water management and nutritional security. The role of Krishi Sakhi is envisioned as farmers' friend at gram panchayat level, with all necessary information, skills and abilities to advise them on various aspects of Natural Farming, and providing capacity building in emerging areas of Natural Farming.

Dr. P. Chandra Shekara, Director General MANAGE, stated that MANAGE is ready to empower Krishi Sakhis as proficient para-extension workers by building a pool of trained master trainers. The Krishi Sakhis knowledge will be improved, evaluated, and the most capable ones will be assigned tasks to implement program of MA&FW at the grassroots level, he said.

During the program, Dr. N. Balasubramani, Director (SA&CCA) MANAGE, provided a detailed procedure for conducting a 5-day training program for Krishi Sakhis to over 170 trainers. He stated, these trainers will undergo upskilling technical sessions on natural farming by Natural Farming Team at MANAGE.

The Team Leader Dr. Ishwar Poojar coordinated the program and team members of natural farming project attended the program.

Training-cum-Exposure Visit Program on Natural Farming



MANAGE organized a five day Training-cum-Exposure Visit Program on "Natural Farming" for the Master Trainers who will train the Krishi Sakhis all over India. The program taking place from February 26 to March 01, 2024. A total 31 scientists from different KVKs participated in the program. In this training, the master trainers acquitted on the conceptual knowledge of Natural Farming including soil health management, pest and disease management, integration of livestock in Natural Farming, cropping and cropping systems, local seed system and planting materials etc.

In his inaugural remarks, Dr. P. Chandrashekara, DG-MANAGE briefed the trainees on importance of communicating science in simple language to the farmers. He also stressed on the effort put into by MANAGE for homogenization of content for teaching Natural Farming to farmers. He further, asked the master trainers to play a key role in generating mass awareness, develop a community resource persons, model farmer and model villages on Natural Farming.

Dr. Balasubramani, Director (SA&CCA), MANAGE, coordinated the program & briefed about the training program, highlighting the importance of knowledge, sustainability, and the challenges associated with natural farming practices.

Agricultural Marketing and Post-harvest Management

MANAGE organized a five day training program on Agricultural Marketing and Post-harvest Management, on February 12-16, 2024. Seventeen officers from Grading & Packaging, Marketing & Horticultural Departments, Gov. of Jammu and Kashmir participated in the program.

Training Program Gender Budgeting in Agriculture under Mission Shakti

KGKLS Series: Lecture No. 29: Challenges and Opportunities in Agriculture Cooperatives by Dr. G.Narendra Kumar, IAS, DG NIRD&PR



Dr. G. Narendra Kumar, IAS, DG NIRD&PR, delivered the 29th MANAGE Krishi Gyandeep Knowledge Lecture Series (KGKLS) on the topic "Convergence opportunities for Rural Development & Agriculture" on 7 February 2024 at MANAGE.

Dr. G. Narendra Kumar eloquently highlighted the concept of convergence, providing subtle information in a conceptual manner. He clarified development and growth from the rural development perspective and underscored the necessity of equitable distribution of the assets to rise opportunities in rural areas and stressed that rural residents should reinvest their earnings back to rural areas instead of channeling them into cities.

He suggested some convergence to generate sustainable employment opportunities including small dairy unit development, infrastructure creation for Agriculture and Natural Resources Management through MGNREGA scheme. Further, he mentioned that agriculture based industries like cold storage facility can be set up with the financial help and training through DDU-GKY Yojna and NRLM program. The takeaway message he provided is the need for indigenous solutions to rural challenges, and avoiding reliance on external aid. In his concluding remarks, Dr. P. Chandra Shekara, DG-MANAGE, said that to avert alarming migration we should focus on creating urban environments and amenities within rural areas. MANAGE faculty, staff, consultants and soldiers of Jai Jawan Kisan Program attended the lecture.

This venture has adopted a very innovative business model of procuring chemical free millets and other agriproduce directly from FPOs and supplying natural farm products to the consumers at reasonable price. It sources naturally cultivated millets from tribal farmers of Andhra Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, and provides market linkages to tribal farmers and realize better farm gate price. The venture aims to expand its retail outlets in different locations of Hyderabad, and upscale this to pan India, in near future.
