The program included participation from 50 soon-to-retire officials from the Army, Navy, and Air Force, representing various states, with support from the Directorate General Resettlement, Ministry of Defence, GOI. The Jai Jawan Kisan initiative is designed to provide ex-servicemen with the skills and knowledge necessary to become agripreneurs, and to contribute to the advancement of the agricultural sector.

In his valedictory address, Dr. Sagar Hanuman Singh, IPoS, Director General, MANAGE and NIPHM,



commended the initiative undertaken by MANAGE and the Ministry of Defence. He urged the participants to disseminate the knowledge and information acquired during the training to farmers at the village level. He also encouraged them to utilize government schemes effectively and begin a new start in agripreneurship or farming, creating additional sources of income. He encouraged Jawans to explore opportunities in startups, including agro-tourism, as part of the next phase of their journey.

The Guest of the Valedictory Function, Lieutenant Colonel (LPC) Iqbal Singh, encouraged the participants to utilize the knowledge and skills acquired during the training to create awareness among farmers at the grassroots level. Annual Training Planning Workshop (ATPW-2025) and National Convention of EEIs and SAMETIS



MANAGE organised a 2-day Annual Training Planning Workshop – 2025 (ATPW-2025) and National Convention of EEIs and SAMETIS on January 09-10, 2025 to assess the training needs of agricultural extension professionals and chalk out training programs for 2025-26. A total of 50 professionals representing MA&FW, GoI, EEIs, SAMETIS, State Agricultural Universities and MANAGE faculty attended the workshop.

In his inaugural address, Dr. Sagar Hanuman Singh, IPoS, Director General, MANAGE and NIPHM underlined the need for MANAGE, EEIs and SAMETIS to design training programs that align with farmers needs at field level.

He also emphasized need

for a thorough mechanism for assessment of training programs and wished that the workshop will brainstorm on latest technologies, digital applications, and national priorities and come up with strategies for designing practical and appropriate training programs.

Dr. Saravanan Raj, Director (Agricultural Extension),



MANAGE highlighted the changes in agriculture sectors and new stakeholders and stressed the need to adopt innovative, diversified approaches, such as blended learning methods to improve quality of training programs for better impact.

Dr. Prashant Armorikar, Additional Commissioner



(Extension), DA&FW, emphasized the need to align training with on-going missions and schemes of Govt. of India.

He highlighted the role of AI tools like ChatGPT, agricultural portals, and online applications in disseminating information and stressed the importance of research institutes in designing effective training modules

around these emerging technologies.

The two-day workshop focused on foresighting future trends in agricultural extension, addressing capacity needs, innovative training methodologies, and collaborative approaches.



Annual Training Planning Workshop (ATPW-2025) and National Convention of EEIs and SAMETIs



Discussions included aligning training programs with emerging needs, leveraging digital tools, strengthening institutional linkages, enhancing networking for knowledge sharing, improving documentation, and exploring the Karmayogi Mission – Transforming Future Training through the iGoT platform and AI for transformative training.

In his valedictory address, Dr. Sagar Hanuman Singh, IPoS, Director General, MANAGE, suggested using the iGOT Platform to acquire functional skills; foster networking and collaboration among MANAGE, EEIs, SAMETIS, SAUs, and other partners; and harness digital advances such as apps and AI tools to make training more effective and productive.



Dr. Prashant Armorikar, Additional Commissioner (Extension), DA&FW, GoI, emphasised the need for monitoring and assessment of training programs and suggested including the priorities of the Government of India in capacity-building programs.

Additionally, participants explored strategies for competency development, infrastructure enhancement, and impact measurement to transform extension training for the future.

Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) Training Program on New Generation Competencies for Agripreneurs



MANAGE organized the two weeks Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) training Program on New Generation Competencies for Agripreneurs on January 15-28, 2025, supported by the Ministry of External Affairs, GOI. Total 21 participants from 14 countries viz Mauritius, Ghana, Ethiopia, Morocco, Tajikistan, Thailand, Nigeria, Uzbekistan, Malawi, Zimbabwe, Republic Democratic of Congo, Sri Lanka, Bhutan, Bangladesh, Eritrea are participated in the program.

In his inaugural address, Dr. Sagar Hanuman Singh, IPoS, Director General, MANAGE, highlighted that this program will be highly beneficial in enhancing knowledge and skills related to agripreneurship. He emphasized the importance of agripreneurship as a key driver of development. Further, he shed light on various aspects, including access to business credit, availability of resources, challenges faced by new startups, access to technology, relevant policies and regulations, and opportunities for trade and networking in the agribusiness sector. When you go back, use the knowledge you have gained here to train and empower more people in your country, he said.

Dr. Saravanan Raj, Director (Agricultural Extension), MANAGE and CEO MANAGE-CIA, provided an overview of the program, emphasizing that the training program has



exclusive participation by women delegates. He highlighted that the program will equip participants with essential competencies for agripreneurship, offer visits to incubation centers, and provide opportunities to gain valuable experience and adopt new skills.

The training focused on enhancing agripreneurship through exposure to Indian agribusiness trends, startups, leadership strategies, and value chain innovations. The program aimed to develop competencies in financial and risk management, sustainable practices, and digital farming. Key sessions included leadership development, gender-specific entrepreneurship, and innovation in value chains.

Participants visited institutions like NIMSME, Rural Tech Park (NIRDPR), T-Hub, ICRISAT, and MANAGE's Incubation Centre, Urban Kisaan R&D, CoE Jeedimetla, and LR Naturals Apiary to further enrich their experience. Participants prepared a back-at-work plan.

Dr. Saravanan Raj, Director (Agricultural Extension), MANAGE & CEO, MANAGE CIA, served as Director for this program, with coordination by Dr. Rahalya S, MANAGE Fellow.



Workshop on Advancing Agricultural Marketing Through Synergy & Reforms



MANAGE organized a two-day workshop on Forging the Future of Agricultural Marketing in India: Synergy Between Marketing and Production Departments to Facilitate Reforms in Agricultural Marketing on January 16-17, 2025. A total 40 participants including Directors, Assistant Directors, Agricultural Officers from State Agriculture Departments, and private sector representatives in agri-marketing from across the country participated in the workshop.

In his inaugural address, Dr. P. G. Chengappa, former Vice-Chancellor, University of Agricultural Sciences (UAS), Bangalore, and Chief Guest of the inaugural program, emphasized the need for a market revolution through the integration of market-driven extension and marketing elements. He encouraged the participants to implement the solutions and gained during the workshop upon returning to their respective states.

Dr. Saravanan Raj, Director (Agricultural Extension), MANAGE, and CEO-MANAGE CIA, emphasized the need to integrate technology with public-private partnerships (PPP) to implement emerging new models of marketing. He stressed that extension and marketing departments should collaborate to add creativity and innovations to



marketing models. Dr. K. C. Gumagolmath, Director (Monitoring & Evaluation), MANAGE, provided a brief overview of the program and shed light on the Act of Regulation of Agricultural Marketing enacted in 1886 and the cooperative movement in India. Additionally, he emphasized the need to empower farmers to effectively compete in international markets.

The program was structured around three main themes: a critical appraisal of marketing reforms in the context of the roles of line departments, exploring economies of scale for small and marginal farmers, and addressing challenges and issues in supply chain integration.

The panel discussions focused on the direction of agricultural marketing reforms in India, highlighting the role of production departments, the use of aggregation to facilitate the marketing of agricultural produce, institutional arrangements for market orientation, and the components of supply chain marketing.

Dr. K. C. Gumagolmath, Director (M&E), MANAGE, Dr. Shalendra, Director (AM), MANAGE, coordinated the workshop along with Dr. Sangamesh, MANAGE Fellow.



Capacity Building for Krishi Sevaks and Sevikas of FPOs under MOVCDNER-Sikkim



MANAGE Organised the two weeks training program on Capacity Building of Krishi Sevaks and Krishi Sevikas of Farmer Producer Organization (FPOs) promoted under MOVCDNER-Sikkim on January 07-21, 2025 at WALAMTARI, Hyderabad. Capacity Building on Integrated Pest Management in Horticulture for Odisha Officials & Farmers
