MANAGE installed 75 kWp Solar Rooftop Grid Connected system at the Academic Building, enhancing institutes self-sufficiency in power consumption to 75%.

With this latest installation, MANAGE's total capacity for solar rooftop grid-connected systems now is 225 kWp, and making it the first institute in Rajendranagar to achieve this capacity.

Transforming Horticulture Sector in Odisha:

Training on Production, Processing and Marketing of Button Mushroom



MANAGE organized a 8-day Training-cum-Exposure Visit Program on "Production, Processing and Marketing of Button Mushroom" on July 02-09, 2024 for Horticultural officers, Horticultural Extension Workers and Farmers from Odisha sponsored by Directorate of Horticulture, Govt. of Odisha.



This is the first program with 53 participants in the series of 24 programs scheduled in 2024-25 covering a total of 1500 officers and farmers from Odisha.

Dr. P Chandra Shekara, DG-MANAGE, in his inaugural address highlighted the high demand for mushrooms in urban areas due to their health benefits, including immunity-boosting substances

and vitamins, antioxidants etc. He stressed need to federate farmers, create cold storage facilities, harness digital marketing platforms and avail schemes of Govt. of Odisha to get more profits in mushroom cultivation.

The program focuses on the nutritional significance and value-added products from mushrooms. It includes the cultivation of button mushrooms, management and waste disposal practices, and business plan preparation for setting up a mushroom enterprise.

Participants received hands-on training in sanitation of area & straw sterilization, pest and disease management, and digital marketing for button mushrooms. The program provides more opportunity for hands-on practice and exposure visits to mushroom units, private mushroom enterprises and technology parks to understand practical issues.

At the end of the program, officers and farmers will prepare back-at-work plans for implementation in next 6 month when they go back to their state. Dr. Veenita Kumari, Deputy Director (Gender Studies), MANAGE served as Director for this program.

Transforming Horticulture Sector in Odisha:

Globally Accepted Best Horticulture Practices



MANAGE organized 8-day Training cum exposure visit Program on "Globally Accepted Best Horticulture Practices" on July 13- 19, 2024 for Horticultural Officers of Odisha State. A total 27 officials from the Directorate of Horticulture from Odisha participated in the program.

The program focused on recent advancements in fruits & vegetable crop production technologies, entrepreneurial opportunities & horticultural value chain development management.

Participants gained hands on experience through a series of exposure visits, including Fruit Research Station in Sangareddy, SKLTSHU, Deccan Exotics, Kattangur Farmer Producer Company Ltd. in Nalgonda, the Centre of Excellence for Fruits in Mulugu, and

Kalagura Gampa, a successful woman entrepreneur's enterprise specializing in horticultural produce processing & value addition. Additionally, an exposure visit to the Floricultural Research Station at SKLTSHU was also organised.


