

He encouraged the effective adoption of these initiatives to promote Secondary Agriculture.

Setting the roadmap for Secondary Agriculture, Dr. P. Chandra Shekara stressed that commodity-specific ICAR Institutes /SAUs need to prepare Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) on value chain models for each commodity and made them available on their websites to foster Secondary Agriculture. He added that in order to promote Secondary Agriculture, it is necessary to establish a

Project Facilitation Centre at each KVK, an online platform to support direct marketing by farmers and make a mandatory purchases of Secondary Agriculture products by public institutes like hostels, schools, hospitals, jails etc.

MANAGE Exhibition: MANAGE showcased its activities, programs, and schemes through three stalls at the exhibition during the seminar. The stalls featured services and products from Agripreneurs and Agri Startups who have been trained and mentored by MANAGE. The stalls attracted more than delegates including scientists, faculty members from Agricultural Universities, Agripreneurs, Agri Startups, farmers, students, and scholars, seeking information and opportunities for collaboration.

LINKING AGRIPRENEURS WITH FARMERS PRODUCER ORGANIZATIONS IN TELANGANA STATE



A meeting was held on Linking Agripreneurs with Farmers Producer Organizations on June 6th 2023 at Regional Office of NABARD-Hyderabad with an objective to converge Agripreneurs trained under AC&ABC Scheme with FPOs in the Telangana State. Dr. P. Chandra Shekara, Director General, MANAGE, Mrs. Susheela Chintala, CGM-NABARD, Nodal officers, Agripreneurs, and FPO representatives participated in the meeting.

In his opening remarks, Dr. P. Chandra Shekara, DG, MANAGE said that the Agripreneurs are part of Agricultural Development and linking them with Farmers Producer Organizations (FPOs) will expand their contribution to farming community. It will benefit both has been Agripreneurs and FPOs, he said.

Mrs. Susheela Chintala, CGM-NABARD stressed that mapping of Agripreneurs trained under ACABC Scheme with FPOs in Telangana is necessary in order to bridge the gap between farmers, industry, and consumers to support demand and supply.

The NABARD Official gave a detailed presentation and highlighted that during the mapping of FPOs in Telangana State, a total 377 FPOs are under NABARD altogether, of which 250 FPOs engaged in the procurement of bulk inputs. TRAINING PROGRAM

PROMOTION OF AGRI-BASED SMES



MANAGE- Centre for Agri-Business Management is inaugurated a 3-day training programme on "Promotion of Agri-based SMEs through Institutional Credit" to be held from June 26-28th, 2023 at MANAGE. The objective of the programme is to facilitate the promotion of agribased Micro & Small Enterprises through access to

institutional credit from banks and financial institutions. It also aims to explore the utilization of various government flagship schemes in this context.

The programme has attracted 25 participants from 16 states. Dr. P. He also mentioned that business plan of SMEs should focus on credit, market linkages and digital aspects of the firm to make it bankable.
