### Public Private Partnership in Agricultural Extension Management



Realizing the importance of public and private sector involvement in extension, the first Feed the Future India Triangular Training (FTF ITT) program on "Public Private Partnership in Agricultural Extension Management" was organized at MANAGE during 17 - 31 October 2016 for extension practitioners of African and Asian countries. The program was inaugurated in the presence of His Excellency Jonathan S. Addleton, Mission Director, USAID-India, His Excellency Samuel Panyin Yalley, High Commissioner of Ghana to India, Dr. Bahiru Duguma, Director, Food Security, USAID, India and Smt. V Usha Rani IAS, Director General MANAGE.

Twenty nine executives from 8 countries viz., Afghanistan, Cambodia, Mongolia, Kenya, Liberia Malawi, Ghana and Mozambique participated in the program.

The executives belonged to diverse areas viz., Civil services, Agriculture and Rural Development, Agricultural Economics, Agricultural Extension and allied areas representing universities, public and private organizations in partner countries.

Training focus was on various aspects of Public - Private Partnership in Agricultural Extension Management. Success stories, case studies were shared apart from panel discussions and interaction with experts. Field visits to various national and international agriculture organizations were also organized for a practical exposure.

Based on the learning, executives presented back at work plans to be executed in their respective countries.

## International Training e-Extension: ICT Applications in Agricultural Extension Management



MANAGE organised a USAID-INDIA-Afghanistan Feed The Future India Triangular International Training (FTF-IIT) Program on 'e-Extension: ICT Applications in Extension Management' during 10–19 October 2016 at the Ministry of Agriculture, Irrigation and Livestock (MAIL), Kabul, Afghanistan.

A total number of 71 delegates representing Ministry of Agriculture, Irrigation and Livestock Headquarters staff and officials from all 34 Provinces of Afghanistan attended this program.

The program was inaugurated by Mr. Abdul Qadeer Jawad, Hon'ble Deputy Minister of Finance and Administration, Afghanistan.

The inaugural function was graced by Mr. Prit Pal Singh, Secretary, Indian High Commission, Kabul, Dr. Hamdulla Hamdard, Director General, Extension, MAIL, Dr. Najib Malik, Senior Policy Adviser and other senior faculty of MAIL.

National e-Governance initiatives of Government of India and major portals including Farmers Portal and m-Kisan Portal of India, Kisan Call Centers (KCC) success stories from various States in India and international initiatives were shared with the executives.

#### Consultative Workshop on Agricultural Journalism

The information demands by farmers are often changing and are highly specific, location-based and time-bound. This necessitates journalists with better understanding of agricultural issues and challenges to cater to information needs of farmers and other stakeholders.

There is need for a cadre of professionals who could effectively communicate agricultural news through print and different electronic media channels for better impact in the farming community. In order to discuss on current issues in agricultural journalism and themes related to capacity development, MANAGE organized a Consultative Workshop on Agricultural Journalism: New Directions for Future, on 9th September 2016.

The participants deliberated on issues relating to potential candidates, content,

program delivery, partnership opportunities and related aspects.

A total of 17 delegates representing professional journalists, correspondents of different print and electronic media, officers in-charge of mass media in Agriculture and Allied Departments, academicians, training specialists, MANAGE Faculty participated in the Workshop.

Smt. V. Usha Rani, IAS, Director General, MANAGE inaugurated a 100 kWp Rooftop Solar PV Project in the Institute on 23rd September, 2016. In the first phase of installation, the plant is designed to meet 40% electricity needs of the Institute. A

remote monitoring system and net metering system was also installed to regularly monitor the system performance. The project is expected to help reduce dependence on grid power supply, generate green power and mitigate GHG emissions.
